

Achievements in 2020-2021

Our aim is to support people to live a full and dignified life of their choosing. Despite the ongoing challenges of the pandemic, we have kept our doors open.

Unfortunately, due to the restrictions, our voluntary income was significantly down last year. We received £429,099, which was measurably less than the income received in 2019-20 of over £778,123. In particular, our income from schools and parishes was reduced severely; we received £100k less than in previous years.

However, we still have so much to be proud of. Thanks to your ongoing support this is what we achieved in 2020-21...



474 older people supported at St Joseph's Care Home and through Young at Heart community project



37 residents currently live at St Joseph's Care Home, receiving 24-hour, person-centred care



Young at Heart supported 437 isolated older people, 122 of whom were new to the project, through seven social groups and befriending



39 people with disabilities supported to live fulfilling, more independent lives of their choosing



16 people with complex care needs receive 24-hour care and support at St Catherine's Bungalows



15 people are supported to live independently at St Vincent's House and one person is supported in his own home



16 people attend daytime activities at St Catherine's Day Service or through outreach work



3978 asylum seekers, refugees and migrants were supported by Brushstrokes Community Project



Brushstrokes gave out over 17,000 bags of food and made over 3,000 deliveries of food, including to families with children in need



Brushstrokes assisted 462 people to apply for the EU settlement scheme



251 children, young people and families supported by our children and families services



17 young people cared for by 15 New Routes foster carers



234 families worked with the Family Support team who helped with free school meals, food parcels and wellbeing checks for children



131 Christmas presents and 40 food hampers given out



262 adults affected by separation from their family of origin came to Origins for support. 69 of these enquiries were related to the former children's homes records



203 people experiencing homelessness supported through accommodation and outreach



Tabor House provided 32 rough sleepers with accommodation and supported a further 171 people through outreach work



Fatima House and Sophia House provided safe shelter to 11 women who would otherwise be homeless



3 local, independent charities received support with employment, HR, policies and procedures, fundraising, advice, guidance and support
